Taking a tumble for clock cleaning

Last newsletter asked "what do rocks and clocks have in common?" I actually had some folks call and wonder what I meant. It was a teaser for the following.

Being in the business of clock repair I don't often miss a chance to look at a new tool or technique. This month's selection for discussion is **rock tumblers** used for horological cleaning and polishing. The jury is still out based on the people I've talked with, but the debate is very interesting.

I want to encourage those who use rock tumblers for cleaning or have used them in the past to share their experiences. Write the editor; I'll report your submissions in a later issue. In the mean time I'm aware of at least 2 of our San Antonio members who have recently purchased one and are in the midst of their own testing and investigations.

What got this rolling (so to speak) was a demonstration I saw from a retail shop here in San Antonio. I saw a common Seth Thomas #89 time and strike movement placed into a tumbler for 30 minutes. The results were not outstanding, in my opinion for the brass plates. What did impress me was the effect on the steel posts, screws and arbors. It was MUCH better than an ultrasonic

would ever do and looked like it had been buffed out, polished or reblued.

In addition there is a substantial cost comparison. A new 12 pound tumbler set up which is adequate to easily handle most time and strike movements and at least some of the smaller three train movements costs about \$160 not including cleaning fluids and abrasive media. A comparable size new ultrasonic is about \$550. The job certainly takes longer with a tumbler set up. You be the judge. Let me hear from you. ☺

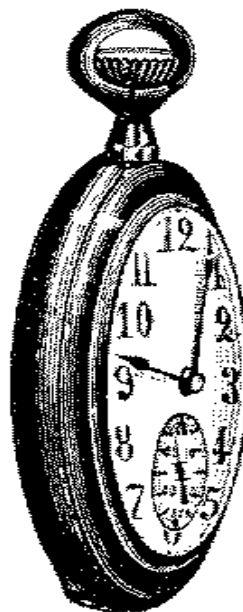

A "tip" for watchmakers

Sometimes having the correct tool makes an impossible job almost easy. If you have problems with traditional pivot drills, like when repivoting a 4th wheel arbor, try a set of carbide twist drill bits. They last longer than HSS drills and go through steel like nobody's business. Harbor Freight carries an assortment of 50 drills for \$12.99 with sizes from #80 to 3/8 inch. Check out their website at <http://www.harborfreight.com> and enter 34640 as the item number. They also have a 20 bit assortment under item number 44824 with sizes .032 to .128 inch. And finally, don't forget to take the temper out of the steel before drilling, even with carbide bits. Take care.☺
