Warning: Reproductions Ahead *submitted by Editor*

Things are changing in our world, rapidly. Included are certainly the significant effects and impact the huge nation of China is having. Those of us in horology are not left untouched.

My full time business is the repair and restoration of antique clocks. I can't say I've seen it all, but I've been fortunate and have had a very nice selection come across my bench from many different makers, styles and nations of origin. Surprises are still out there, but they present themselves less and less often these days. The purpose of this piece is to bring to

your attention the work, much of which is absolutely amazing, of the Chinese reproduction.

Especially on the Internet and

specifically on Ebay you can easily find many models of swingers, calendar clocks, French clocks and bronzes. These are NOT the clocks we've seen from Taiwan in the past!

I have in my shop at the moment four examples of reproductions produced in China. The first is a 2 day small Junghans elephant swinger. The second is an Ithaca double dial, model number 3. The third is a mantle size fancy French temperature compensating pendulum. And lastly is a Gale astronomical short drop wall model calendar clock. I bought each of these with the full knowledge they were reproductions, each are stunning they are so accurate in detail and appearance. Without a very detailed familiarity of the specific makers and models I think each of these pieces could easily pass for period pieces. That is a good thing and a bad thing. It's wonderful for those of us in the restoration business because often original parts and pieces are simply not available to complete a job, especially for decorative

case ornamentation. It is a questionable thing however in that not all sellers and restorers are 100 percent up front with their customers about the origin of their inventory. That is assuming they themselves know.

I've personally heard one of our chapter members, who will remain nameless, say even with his very extensive experience in the business of antiques and clocks these days he would not buy a metal mantle clock unless he knew the seller well. It's simply too easy to get fooled.
